I have held this position since approximately May 1988. As Deputy Registrar I have been assigned responsibility for the management of administrative support to the Medical Board of Queensland ("the Board"), since around mid-1992.
- 3. On 4 December 2002 a Ministerial Brief was prepared outlining the issues involved in the registration of Vincent Victor Berg. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-1" is a copy of the Ministerial Brief. A copy of this information was also provided to Dr Andrew Johnson on 5 December 2002.

- 4. Berg first applied to the Board for conditional registration on 14 July 1999. The Board subsequently resolved to decline the registration on 24 August 1999. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-2" is a true copy of the Minutes of the Board meeting.
- In mid October 1999 Townsville Health Service District notified the Board that 5. Berg had been appointed to a Psychiatry Registrar position at Townsville General Hospital on 29 September 1999, subject to him obtaining registration with the Board. The Hospital sought urgent consideration of conditional registration for Berg for this purpose. At the October 1999 Registration Advisory Committee ("RAC") meeting, it was recommended that Berg be approved registration for 12 months to undertake postgraduate training upon completion of registration requirements which included completion of documentation and interview. Approval was given by the Board in accordance with the RAC recommendation at its meeting on 26 October 1999. Berg personally lodged his application for registration at the Board's office on 13 December 1999 and he was interviewed thereafter by the Deputy Director of Medical Services, Townsville General Hospital on behalf of the Board on 4 January 2000. The "in principle" approval of Berg's registration became absolute from that date. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-3" is a true copy of the Application for Registration as Medical Practitioner. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-4" is a true copy of an extract of Minutes of the meeting of the Board.
- 6. On 16 February 2000 the Registrar of the Board requested Berg to explain the difference in his name, Vincent Victor Berg, under which he applied for registration, and Tchekaline Victor Vladimirovich, the name on his primary medical certificate from the Voronezh State University in Russia. Berg responded in a letter dated 22 February 2000 that he had changed his name through the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs ("the Immigration Department") for security reasons. On 7 March 2000 Dr Barry Hodges of Townsville Health Service District wrote to the Registrar of the Board enclosing a Statutory Declaration of Berg and a letter from the Immigration Department, explaining the name change. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-5," is a true copy of the letter from the Registrar to Berg; annexed

- 8. In a letter dated 4 May 2000 Dr Barry Hodges advised the Board of the details of Berg's post graduate training program.
- 9. On 4 December 2000 the OHPRB received an application from Berg for registration as a specialist in Psychiatry. The Board resolved at its meeting on 9 January 2001 not to approve the specialist registration as Berg did not hold a qualification upon which such registration could be based. The Board also resolved to request the Immigration Department to enquire as to whether Tchekaline Victor Vladimirovich graduated from Voronezh State University. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-8" is a true copy of the Minutes of the Board.
- 10. On 12 February 2001 the Assistant Registrar of the Board wrote to the Australian Embassy in Moscow enclosing copies of the degree provided by Berg and its translation with a request that the Embassy make enquiries to determine the authenticity of the degree. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-9" is a true copy of this letter. As far as I am aware the Board never received a response to the request that the Embassy enquire as to the authenticity of these qualifications.
- 11. The Board resolved at its meeting on 27 February 2001 that it reaffirm the decision not to grant Berg conditional registration and to advise Berg that he could forward his qualifications to the Australian Medical Council ("the AMC") for assessment by RANZCP. A letter advising Berg of these decisions was sent to Berg on or about 12 March 2001. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-10" and "MDG-11" respectively are true copies of the Minutes of the meeting of the Board and the letter from the Registrar to Berg.

- 12. On 31 July 2001 the Board forwarded a Certificate of Standing to the Australian Medical Council which stated that Berg held conditional registration from 4 January 2000 to 3 January 2001. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-12" is a true copy of this Certificate.
- On 19 October 2001 the OHPRB received a copy of a letter from Gail McKenzie, Administrative Officer Training and Assessment RANZCP, to Mr Ian Frank of the Australian Medical Council dated 16 October 2001. This letter advised that RANZCP confirmed overseas psychiatric qualifications with the relevant University. RANZCP were informed that Voronezh State University did not produce the relevant diploma number and the particular educational program did not exist in the year Berg claimed to have graduated. RANZCP were then informed that the diplomas were forgeries and not produced by the University. This was the first time that the Board were made aware of this information. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-13" is a true copy of this letter.
- On 25 October 2001 the AMC sent to the Board a faxed copy of a letter addressed to Berg. This letter advised Berg of the penalties for supplying false information and invited Berg to respond to their letter. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-14" is a true copy of the facsimile received from the AMC.
- 15. Berg then sent two letters dated 30 October 2001 and 11 November 2001 to lan Frank of the Australian Medical Council. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-15" and "MDG-16" are true copies of these letters.
- 16. On 10 January 2002 the Board issued a Certificate of Good Standing directly to Berg, noting that the Board had been unable to verify Berg's qualifications. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-17" is a true copy of the Certificate.
- 17. On 22 January 2002 the Board noted the concerns in relation to the authenticity of the documentation supplied by Dr Berg. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-18" is a true copy of the Minutes of the Board.
- On 1 February 2002 the OHPRB received a letter from Mr Craig Glenroy Patterson of RANZCP advising that RANZCP could not proceed with Dr Berg's specialist assessment because of concerns with his documentation

after information was obtained from Russia. The Board noted the correspondence received from RANZCP at its meeting on 26 February 2002. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-19" and "MDG-20" are true copies of the letter from RANZCP and the Minutes of the Board.

- 19. On 13 December 2002 the OHPRB received a letter from Ken Whelan, District Manager of the Townsville Health Service District dated 6 December 2002. The letter was copied to Dr Lloyd Toft, then President of the Medical Board of Queensland and Dr Steve Buckland, then General Manager, Health Services, Queensland Health. Mr Whelan requested information as to the reason Queensland Health was not notified that there was an issue regarding the authenticity of Berg's qualifications. Mr Whelan requested that the Board report the matter to the police. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-21" is a true copy of this letter.
- 20. The Board noted the correspondence received from Mr Whelan at its meeting on 14 January 2003. In relation to the last sentence of the third paragraph of Mr Whelan's letter, I note that Queensland Health had already approved Berg's employment in September 1999. The Board resolved to respond to Mr Whelan's correspondence. Annexed hereto and marked "MDG-22" is a true copy of the Minutes of the meeting of the Board.
- 21. On 28 January 2003 Dr Lloyd Toft wrote to Mr Whelan, regretting that the Townsville Health Service District had not been advised that Berg did not hold relevant qualifications which would have allowed him to undertake postgraduate training when this had been discovered. The letter also advised that a process had been put in place to ensure that an employer is notified if it is discovered that a registered practitioner does not hold the relevant qualifications. A true copy of this letter is annexed hereto and marked "MDG-23".
- 22. It is now regarded as a matter of administrative procedure that employers and others with a legitimate interest should be notified of any such cases of forgery.

- 23. My recollection is that the Board decided that as the practitioner was no longer registered in Queensland there was little which could be done in contacting the police, other than to ensure procedures that such situations did not arise again.
- 24. I am aware that Dr Buckland was to receive a copy of the letter exhibited as "MDG-21." I have not discussed this matter with Dr Buckland and do not whether or not any member of the Board discussed this matter with Dr Buckland.
- 25. I recall having discussions with representatives of the Northern Territory Medical Board, Darwin or Alice Springs Hospital in relation to Berg. I believed I informed the caller of our experience with Berg and the concerns regarding his credentials. In relation to inquiries on behalf of the Western Australian Medical Board on 11 February 2002, I note that similar concerns were raised with the representative and the Board was later advised of the cancellation of Berg's registration in that State on 28 February 2002.
- 26. Under the current more stringent registration procedures for assessment of Special Purpose applicants, the verification of all documentation is now checked by a senior assessment officer who would then brief myself and the Registration Advisory Committee of any concerns.

Ministerial Brief - Vincent Berg

Berg wrote to the Board on 10 June 1999 seeking registration, preferably as a psychiatrist. He indicated he was prepared to update his clinical professional knowledge by undertaking postgraduate study and advised that:

- He was born in 1952 and had graduated with a Doctor's Degree in Psychiatry from the Medical Faculty of Voronezh State University (Russia) in 1977.
- He also claimed to have been awarded a PhD in Psychology and worked as a senior lecturer at the University until April 1982 and as a psychiatrist until August 1986.
- His medical career ceased in Russia when he was arrested by the KGB in August 1986 in connection with his political and religious beliefs.
- He arrived in Australia in December 1992, was granted protection as a refugee in October 1993, and subsequently gained permanent residency in 1994.

Berg had apparently been attached to the Gold Coast Hospital as a clinical observer and registration for this purpose was sought by the Gold Coast Hospital on 12 July 1999. At its meeting on 24 August 1999, the Board declined to approve conditional registration for Berg to work as a clinical observer at the Hospital on the basis that such an activity did not require registration.

On 29 September 1999, Townsville General Hospital, with the approval of the Chief Health Officer, appointed Berg to the position of Registrar – Psychiatry, subject to Berg obtaining registration with the Board.

On 13 December 1999, Berg applied for conditional registration seeking to undertake training in psychiatry at Townsville General Hospital. Conditional registration for this purpose, for a period of 12 months, was subsequently approved by the Board effective from 4 January 2000. A training program, nominating Dr John Allan FRANZCP as his supervisor, was received on 10 May 2000.

On 16 February 2000, Berg was given notice by the Board to explain discrepancies in his documentation within 14 days or his registration would be cancelled. A review of the file had identified that all claimed professional certificates were in fact in another name and had been manually altered to the name 'Berg'.

Documentation obtained from the Department of Immigration under Freedom of Information by Berg appeared to confirm that in 1996 he had declared a change of name from the name in the documents to the name 'Berg'. A decision was made by the Board not to pursue this matter further.

In July 2000, Berg complained to the Board regarding alleged inconsistencies in his circumstances compared to those of another unnamed overseas trained psychiatrist alleging discrimination. He was informed that the issue he raised should more properly be addressed by the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists or his employer.

On 4 December 2000, Berg applied for conditional registration as a specialist psychiatrist in Queensland. He cited his qualification from Voronezh State University as the basis of his application. On 4 January 2001, the Board determined not to approve his application as the qualification was in a name other than the applicant's name and the qualification was in any case not recognized. It was also noted by the Board that with regard to the confirmation that Berg was one and the same person as the person named in the documents, the Department of Immigration had subsequently acknowledged that the Department would not have made enquiries relating to any qualification allegedly held by the person.

The Board determined that the Department be requested to make enquiries through the Moscow office as to whether the person named in the documents was in fact a graduate of the Voronezh State University in 1977. Berg was formally notified on 5 February 2001 of the Board's refusal of his application for conditional registration as a specialist (psychiatrist) and he was informed of his appeal rights. It should be noted that Berg's conditional registration to undertake training in this specialty was time limited and expired on 3 January 2001.

Berg wrote to the Board on 12 February 2001 seeking reconsideration but the Board reaffirmed its decision and suggested he submit his qualifications and experience to the Australian Medical Council for assessment by the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists.

On 17 March 2001, Berg requested the Board issue a Certificate of Good Standing to the Northern Territory covering the period of his Queensland registration. Subsequently on 23 January 2001, the New Zealand Medical Board sought advice regarding Berg as he had sought registration in that country and on 31 July 2001 a further Certificate of Good Standing was sought by the Australian Medical Council, apparently in connection with the assessment of Berg's specialist qualification. In this regard, Berg had made an application to the Council for such an assessment as he had been advised to do by the Board on 12 February 2001.

While the Board had no proof that the qualifications relied on by Berg were fraudulent documents, it had sufficient concern not to issue a Certificate of Good Standing and in lieu only issued a Certificate of Standing. This is an indication to other regulatory authorities that the application should be carefully assessed.

The assessment undertaken by the Australian Medical Council, through the College, was extensive given the concerns raised by the Board and other regulatory authorities about the standing of the qualifications relied on Berg.

On 16 October 2001, the College wrote to the Australian Medical Council and the Boards advising that it had directly contacted Voronezh State University in an attempt to confirm Berg's qualifications. The University denied that the Certificates related to a graduate of that institution and stated that the documents were in fact forgeries.

There is no evidence that Berg has been registered in any Australian State or Territory since the College advice was received in October 2001.

It should be noted that:

- Berg was conditionally registered to undertake training in psychiatry at Townsville General Hospital from 4 January 2000 to 3 January 2001.
- The Board did not renew this conditional registration and refused Berg's application for conditional registration as a psychiatrist on the basis of its concerns about his documentation.
- The Board referred Berg to the Australian Medical Council for a detailed assessment of his qualifications through the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists.
- The Board's concerns were subsequently confirmed 10 months later through the extensive assessment process undertaken through the Australian Medical Council by the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists.



The Voronezh State University replied informing the RANZCP that they did not produce diploma number 723438 "Medical Degree in Psychiatry" and moreover the educational program stated was not in existence in 1977. The Voronezh State University requested faxed copies of Degree M-I No. 723438 "Medical Doctor in Psychiatry" and Degree MC XII No. 14211 "Candidate of Sciences in Psychology" for review, see attached email and facsimile to Sharon Rayner (trainee staff member) dated 10 and 17 September 2001.

After review of the faxed qualifications, Sergey Zapriagaev from the Voronezh State University emailed the College stating that the documents were crude forgeries, see attached email dated 11 September 2001. I refer to your application for assessment for recognition as a medical specialist by the AMC/Specialist Medical College procedure.

The AMC has been advised by the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists (RANZCP) that the Training and Examinations Exemptions Sub-committee formally considered your application for specialist assessment/advanced standing on 20 September 2001.

You stated in your application to the AMC and the RANZCP that you obtained your primary medical qualifications (1975) and your Doctorate of Medicine in Psychiatry (1977) from the Voronezh State University in Russia. Your submitted qualifications are in the name of Techkaline Victor Vladimirovich - which, in your Statutory Declaration dated 1 August 2001 you stated you changed to Vincent Victor Berg.

As part of the RANZCP's standard assessment process, an applicant's overseas psychiatric qualifications are confirmed with the relevant College/University or Authority. In the case of your application, the email address of the Voronezh State University in Russia was obtained and the University was contacted to confirm your qualifications in Psychiatry (in the name of Dr

The Voronezh State University replied, informing the RANZCP that the University did not produce diploma number 723438 "Medical Degree in Psychiatry" and, moreover, the educational program stated was not in existence in 1977. The Voronezh State University requested from the RANZCP faxed copies of Degree M-I No. 723438 "Medical Doctor in Psychiatry" and Degree MC XII No. 14211 "Candidate of Sciences in Psychology" for review.

After review of the qualifications, as faxed, the Voronezh State University emailed the RANZCP, stating that the documents were crude forgeries. The Voronezh State University confirmed this statement, by fax, on Voronezh State University letterhead dated 17 September 2001.

On the basis of the information obtained by the RANZCP from the Voronezh State University, it appears you have provided false documents in support of your application for specialist assessment/advanced standing.

You are reminded of the following statement, which is reproduced from page 25 of the AMC's Information Booklet for Applicants - AMC/Specialist Medical College Assessment Procedures Information 2001 Edition:

"Penalties for making False Declarations

- D28 A person who wilfully makes a false statement in a Statutory Declaration under the Statutory Declarations Act 1959, as amended, is guilty of an offence against that Act, the punishment of which is a fine not exceeding \$200 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or both if the offence is prosecuted summarily, or for a term not exceeding four years if the offence is prosecuted upon indictment.
- An applicant for specialist assessment who wilfully makes a false statement or provides false information in his/her Application Forms or in the documents attached may forfeit his or her eligibility to present for assessment or be accorded recognition by an Australian or Australasian Specialist Medical College, or be subject to de-registration (if registration has already been obtained) and/or other penalties as prescribed in the relevant State or Territory medical registration laws."

I invite you to put before the AMC any information or documentation that you consider relevant and that will assist the AMC and the RANZCP in taking a decision on this matter.

Your application for specialist assessment has been deferred by the AMC, pending receipt and consideration of the requested information or documentation.

I write on behalf of the Fellowship Board Training and Examinations Exemptions Sub-committee regarding Dr Berg's application for specialist assessment/advanced standing. The Training and Examinations Exemptions Sub-committee formally considered this matter on the 20 September 2001.

Dr Berg stated in his application to the Australian Medical Council and the RANZCP, that he obtained his primary medical qualification (1975) and his Doctorate of Medicine in Psychiatry (1977) from the Voronezh State University in Russia. Dr Berg's submitted qualifications are in the name of Techkaline Victor Vladimirovich, which Dr Berg states in his Statutory Declaration dated 1 August 2001, he changed to Vincent Victor Berg.

As part of the standard RANZCP assessment process, applicants' overseas psychiatric qualifications are confirmed with the relevant College/University or Authority. The email address of the Voronezh State University in Russia was obtained via the internet and was contacted to confirm Dr Techkaline's qualifications in Psychiatry.

The Voronezh State University replied informing the RANZCP that they did not produce diploma number 723438 "Medical Degree in Psychiatry" and moreover the educational program stated was not in existence in 1977. The Voronezh State University requested faxed copies of Degree M-L No. 723438 "Medical Doctor in Psychiatry" and Degree MC XII No. 14211 "Candidate of Sciences in Psychology" for review, see attached email and facsimile to Sharon Rayner (trainee staff member) dated 10 and 17 September 2001.

After review of the faxed qualifications, Sergey Zapriagaev from the Voronezh State University emailed the College stating that the documents were crude forgeries, see attached email dated 11 September 2001. Faxed confirmation of this statement on Voronezh State University letterhead dated 17 September 2001, is also attached.

1, Voronezh State University did not produce the diploma "Medical Degree in Psychiatry" number 723438,

Moreover university had not such educational programs in 1977.

2. Are you sure, that the diploma just Voronezh State University? You have not sent me the full number of diploma, as it contains also letterrings (for example ABC 222222). The best variant to understand this situation is to send us dublicates of the diplomas or fax (0732-789755 to my name) or as picture file (by e-mail). In this case we can see by whom the diploma is signed. The candidate of sciences diploma is produced by Higher Certification Commission in Moscow. But by number (more the letterrings need, and the number of figures is incorrectly), represented by you is not original.

Besides usual time, which is required to protect a candidate thesis makes about three years after a finishing the university education.

- 4. Thus, if in the diplomas the essential elements of Voronezh State university are really indicated, this diplomas are false.
- 5. However for the final inference it is desirable to see dublicates of the diplomas.

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Dear Mr. Frank,

Responding to your letter of 25.10.01, I have to stress my fervent protest against:

- 1. The action of the RANZCP, requesting information about myself from the Russian Federation.
- 2. Any consideration of any information about myself obtained from the Russian Federation.
- 3. Any decisions concerning myself on the basis of any information about myself received from the Russian Federation.
- 4. Any suspicions and accusations regarding myself on the basis of any information about myself received from the Russian Federation.

I base my protest on the following legal points:

1. I have been officially recognised as a political refugee by the Australian federal authorities and granted domestic protection. In my application to the AMC, I have provided certified copies of documents legally proving this. It is a violation of international laws and agreements about refugees as well as Australian laws to make any inquires about a refugee in a country of his/her origin without the consent of the refugee. I have never been officially asked for permission to contact the Russian Federation on my behalf and under no circumstances given any permission to do this. Moreover, in "Explanatory Notes" submitted with my application, I have clearly stated in special paragraph called "Security concerns, regarding contacts with Russian Federation": "I am not in a position to disclose the direct factors, threatening my life, and this cannot be the matter of the AMC consideration. My purpose is to inform you that I am trying to avoid any contacts with Russian Federation and even with Russian communities and persons of Russian origin in Australia. Thus, I am not in a position to give permission for any direct or indirect contacts with Russian Federation on my behalf." Yet, the RANZCP has contacted the Russian Federation without my permission, against

my will and despite my warnings. I consider this action as illegal, violating Australian and international laws and making considerable damage to myself. You write in your letter that "as part of the RANZCP's standard assessment process, an applicant's overseas psychiatric qualifications are confirmed with the relevant College/University or Authority". It is understandable. However, it is not only understandable, but also determined by the law that there are certain objective legal limitations in refugee's cases derived from a refugee status. In my letter of 19.07.00 to Mr. Peter Lindsay, Federal MP for Herbert, the RANZCP and Medical Board of Queensland (I enclose a copy of that letter), I have called an attention to the unintentional discrimination of refugees because of the limitation derived from their refugee status, for example, "the lack of professional referees reports from a country of origin, inability to make any inquires to any authorities or persons in a refugee's country of origin, and so forth". I doubt that "the RANZCP's standard assessment process", which you are referring to, should be outside or above international and Australian laws concerned and violate them. Therefore, I consider the RANZCP's action of contacting the Russian Federation without my consent as illegal and fervently protest against it.

2. According to the laws, concerning refugees, the legal recognition of a refugee status means an official acknowledgement by relevant authorities (in my case, Australian federal authorities) that a refugee was or has or could be illegally persecuted by the authorities of a country of origin with a real threat to refugee's life. Consequently, any inquires about a refugee from any authorities of a country of origin must not be made without a refugee's consent. No information obtained from these sources can be trusted and have any legal consequences. Therefore, I am officially stating that the information concerning myself illegally obtained by the RANZCP from the Voronezh State University must not be trusted and must not have any legal consideration and consequences. This information is false and should be viewed as non-existent within the assessment of my qualifications and experience. Besides, I would like to see any legal reasons officially stated by the AMC and RANZCP, according to which they must trust any Russian authorities widely known by their lies and disinformation, rather than myself. I would like to see any legal reasons officially stated by the AMC and RANZCP, according to which they must trust any Russian authorities, which have illegally persecuted me and have a certain interest in discrediting me, rather than myself. Plus, I have to address you again to the "Explanatory Notes" submitted with my application, where I mentioned that "I was selected to undertake an exclusive course, which was designed to prepare highly qualified physician-psychiatrists for a work in some special government departments, such as the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Defence, Ministry of Internal Affairs, and the KGB. This course offered the study of Medicine with major in Psychiatry, combining undergraduate general medical study with postgraduate psychiatric specialist training". I am not in a position to tell you more about this course, but can only stress again that it was a special course, and no authority in the Russian Federation would ever disclose any information about this course and its students even within Russia, particularly to a foreign country. For this reason, there are three possibilities why the authorities of the Voronezh State University has provided to the RANZCP disinformation about myself: (1) most likely, they do not have an access to the relevant information, and their disinformation has been sincere; (2) less likely, they have an access to the relevant information and lied intentionally; (3) possibly, they showed the RANZCP's request to the special

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services, and they decided to use the opportunity provided by the RANZCP to discredit me.

According to the all above mentioned I insist that:

- ❖ I have not provided false documents in support of my application for specialist assessment/advanced standing — all the documents and information provided are authentic. I am prepared to sign a Statutory Declaration about this, if required.
- No information from the Russian Federation concerning myself must be requested and considered and has any legal significance and consequence.
- All the limitation derived from my legal refugee status must be accepted, and the assessment must be made on the basis of documents and information submitted as well as information obtained from my referees and within Australia.
- ❖ The RANZCP's mistake should be quickly corrected that the assessment would be finalised as soon as it is possible.

I would like to express hope that the AMC and RANZCP should have more reasons to trust the Australian government, which scrutinised me and accepted as a political refugee under its protection, rather than those Russian authorities against which the Australian government is kindly protecting me.

I would like to express hope that the AMC and RANZCP should have more reasons to trust fellows of the RANZCP Professor Philip Morris and Drs. Diana Hamilton and Ian Wilson as well as my referees Drs. Leon Petchkovsky, Brian Boettcher, and Barend Vorster consultant-psychiatrists, who evaluated my professional knowledge, experience and performance in Australia very positively, and not to make professional idiots of them rather than to trust those unknown to them Russian authorities discredited themselves in many widely known cases by lies and disinformation of the international community.

Finally, I trust that the AMC and RANZCP are parts of the Australian community and realise that their decision in my case will have significant social consequence. They should not step aside or arise above community, letting the government to deal with the life of 50-year-old psychiatrist, who has gone through so many hardships and is now unemployed and facing bankruptcy.

I am looking forward for your urgent help.

Dear Mr. Frank,

By my request, three highly qualified and experienced Australian lawyers, specialising in the immigration and refugee laws, have undertaken a special research concerning situation with the assessment and recognition of my professional qualifications and experience. They have studied relevant international and Australian laws, agreements, and experience.

An outcome of their research suggests that:

Making formal inquires about any person without consent and knowledge of that
person and, particularly, against his/her will is a serious violation of the Australian
Privacy Act 1988 and, additionally, is a breach of the United Nations Convention
on the Status of Refugees of 28 July 1951 modified by the Protocol of 31 January
1967, if concerned person has been legally recognised as a refugee.

 All legal matters, concerning refugees, have been regulated by the United Nations Convention on the Status of Refugees of 28 July 1951 modified by the Protocol of 31 January 1967. All the countries signed this convention are obliged to follow its determinations and rules in their local laws. Australia has signed this Convention in 1982.

Determining legal meaning of "the refugee", this Convention stresses that the
country of origin of such a person is unable or unwilling to protect his/her human
rights. This means that the Convention eliminates the legal credibility of the
country of origin towards the refugee.

 As a result, the Convention automatically disallows any legal significance of any information regarding the refugee derived or obtained from the country of origin.

 Accordingly, nether the Convention nor any official documents of The Office of The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) mention making inquires about the refugee from the country of origin as a recommended or legal practice. Moreover, discussing the assessment and recognition of qualifications and professional experience of the refugee, the UNHCR stresses that the approach different from usual should be used, the refugee should not be discriminated because of the reasons associated with the refugee status and the assessment should not be refused "even in cases in which the qualifications obtained in one of the Parties cannot be proven through documentary evidence".

Concerning the assessment and recognition of qualifications and professional experience of the refugee, the UNHCR refers to the recommendations of the Lisbon 1997, Strasbourg 1999, and Brussels 2000 conferences on refugees' problems as well as to the relevant experience of leading in this area countries

such as Canada and European Union (EU).

In the case of the refugee, the assessment and recognition of qualifications and

professional experience is based on the following principles:

1. An assessment process should be as short as possible (not exceeding 4 months in any case) and made clear and understandable for the refugee with the help of personal interviews (if available) or interviews via phone, fax, mail and e-mail, whatever is available, that to clarify any uncertainty and doubt and to avoid costly court hearings of the refugee's claims.

2. An assessment of the educational system of the country of origin and of the professional training completed by the refugee uses handbooks provided by independent agencies and offering descriptions of the examined educational system, university and course, but not the

information provided by the country of origin.

3. An assessment of competence is used instead of the assessment of

documents.

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4. If documents required are not full or their authenticity cannot be legally confirmed, sworn statements before a legal authority may be accepted in lieu of full and authentic documentation.

5. Provisional recognition should be used, if required.

In accordance to the above stated legal principles and in addition to my letter of 30.10.01, I respectfully suggest to the Australian Medical Council and Royal Áustralian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists:

To accept my sworn statement before a legal authority that all my documents and information provided by me for the assessment of my

qualifications and experience are authentic.

To accept, also, that my competence as a medical practitioner and specialist-psychiatrist is proved by my successful work in Australian Psychiatry and confirmed by the Medical Board of Queensland in its Certificate of Good Standing; by positive reports of my referees Drs. L. Petchkovsky, B. Boettcher, and B. Vorster - consultant-psychiatrists, as well as of fellows of the RANZCP Prof. Ph. Morris, and Drs. D. Hamilton and I. Wilson; and by the positive letters of my patients and their relatives.

Dr Berg was granted conditional registration from 4 January 2000 expiring on 3 January 2001 to enable him to undertake postgraduate training in medicine at The Townsville Hospital.

The Board has not been able to verify the qualification on which Dr Berg's registration was granted.

I write to express my significant concern at the Medical Board's handling of matters surrounding Vincent Victor Berg.

It has come to my attention that the Medical Board was made aware in January 2002 that Vincent Victor Berg allegedly did not hold the primary medical qualifications he claimed in order to obtain registration in Queensland.

I am advised that you noted this was the case and did not seek to notify the Townsville Health Service District, which had been his sole employer during the period of his registration. It needs to be noted that Queensland Health employed Mr Berg on the belief that preliminary registration had been granted by the Medical Board.

We are now faced with the task of identifying all patients seen by Vincent Berg over the period of his tenure with the Townsville Health Service District to identify whether there has been any adverse outcomes for patients.

The time delay in finding out this information, which was only identified as an incidental remark in discussions with the College of Psychiatrists, has lead to significantly increasing the difficulty for the District and has potentially left patients at risk over a much longer period than was necessary.

I seek your explanation for the failure to notify the Townsville Health Service District and your undertaking that procedures will change within the Medical Board to ensure that we are notified of any significant issues in the future in a timely manner.

Further I seek your assurance that the Medical Board will be reporting this matter to the Police for investigation as a criminal offence.
