1. MANAGEMENT ISSUES

COMMUNICATION

- The Surgical Access Service provided a number of briefings and submissions throughout November to the Office of the Director-General and General Manager (Health Services) (GMHS) including:
 - A briefing to the GMHS relating to the release of Emergency Department performance data;
 - A submission to the GMHS requesting funding to support a proposal from the Royal Brisbane Hospital to undertake additional plastic surgery cases;
 - A submission to the GMHS outlining changes to the quarterly emergency department benchmarking report to be distributed to District Managers, Medical Superintendents and Emergency Department Directors.
- The Surgical Access Service provided a number of briefings throughout November to the Office of the Minister for Health including:
 - A briefing to provide information on local hospital waiting lists for the Minister's visit to the Northern Zone including Cooktown, Mossman and Cairns Districts.
- The Surgical Access Service prepared a response to a FOI request (no.1365) for all documentation from Queensland public hospitals relating to:
 - The number of intra-district ambulance re-diversions from 1 January 2002;
 - The percentage of patients who have waited more than eight hours in emergency departments from 1 January 2002.

CONSULTATION

- The Medical Superintendent's Advisory Committee met on 15th November 2002.
- A combined meeting of the Elective Surgery Coordinators and Elective Surgery Liaison Officers met on 29th November 2002.
- The Specialist Outpatient Advisory Committee met on 22nd November 2002.

2. FUNDING & INCENTIVES

- A submission to the GMHS was prepared for increasing elective Plastic Surgery throughput at the Royal Brisbane Hospital (\$587,000). This proposed employment of an additional plastic surgical registrar, and increased usage of operating theatre sessions.
- Advice of financial adjustments for activity not achieved during 2001/02 was forwarded to District Managers for comment, prior to recovery of unused funds. Joint submissions with the Zones are being prepared for December. These funds form the pool of roll-over funding used to purchase additional ES capacity, and establish new services during 2002/03 and 2003/04.
- A suite of management and activity reports has been developed for the Elective Surgery Coordinators at each hospital. These were demonstrated during November, and will be deployed during December and January.

3. PERFORMANCE REPORTING

WAITING LIST

The **total number** of patients on the waiting lists at the reporting hospitals increased from 37,531 at 1 November 2002 to 37,760 at 1 December 2002 (229 patients).

Category 1

• At 1 December 2002, the number of 'long wait' Category 1 patients on elective surgery waiting lists was 48 (2.0%). This figure is a decrease of 9 patients from the 57 'long wait' cases (2.5%) reported at 1 November 2002. A total of two (2) hospitals reported in excess of 5% 'long waits'.

Category 2

• At 1 December 2002, the number of 'long wait' Category 2 patients on elective surgery waiting lists was 1,487 (13.6%). This is a decrease of 238 patients from the 1,725 (15.3%) 'long waits' reported at 1 November 2002. This compares with 1,367 (12.6%) 'long wait' Category 2 patients at 1 December 2001. A total of sixteen (16) facilities reported 'long wait' patients in excess of the 5% benchmark.

Category 3

• At 1 December 2002, the number of 'long wait' Category 3 patients on elective surgery waiting lists was 9,231 (37.8%). This figure is an increase of 289 patients from the 8,942 cases (37.3%) waiting longer than one year at 1 November 2002. This compares with 9,412 (37.4%) 'long wait' Category 3 patients at 1 December 2001.

THROUGHPUT

Overall elective surgery throughput (Category One, Two and Three) has decreased from 10,667 elective surgery admissions in October 2002 to 9,902 in November 2002 (cf. 11,015 in November 2001). Overall elective surgery throughput for the 2002/2003 financial year compared with previous financial years is included in the following table. Throughput for the 2002/2003 financial year is down by 3.9% (-1,988 admissions) on the throughput recorded for 2001/2002 and down by 0.8% (-294 admissions) on the throughput recorded for 2000/2001.

4. CLINICAL BEST PRACTICE

1. Emergency Departments

Emergency Department Information - AHCA Renegotiation

- Information relating to emergency department patient referral sources was prepared and provided for the Queensland Health Australian Healthcare Agreement Negotiation Team.
- Input was provided for the draft national paper for health ministers on emergency department attendances and relationship to general practice services.

2. Benchmarking

Emergency Department Waiting Times

Preliminary waiting time performance data for November 2002 indicates an improved performance in ATS Categories 3 and 5, and a slight decline in other Categories, compared to November 2001.
Preliminary data shows a significant improvement in performance from the previous month.



Specialist Outpatient Services

Patients awaiting an initial surgical outpatient appointment, including those patients with an appointment and those without, are presented on a zonal basis, and compared to the same month of last year.



5. HEALTH SYSTEMS DEVELOPMENT

1. Emergency Departments

EDIS Implementation

- In October 2002, the General Manager (Health Services) requested the Surgical Access Service undertake an evaluation of the MedTrak Emergency Department system and provide advice as to its suitability for use in Queensland Emergency Departments. The Surgical Access Service, in consultation with the CIS team organised a one-day workshop on 15 November 2002 whereby representatives from TrakHealth and The Austin Repatriation Medical Centre demonstrated the most current version of the software to a group of Queensland emergency department clinicians.
- While the MedTrak product did offer some benefits to Queensland emergency departments (eg online radiology and pathology, easily interfaces to other TrakHealth moduls), the reference committee assessed the MedTrak Emergency Department System as currently not meeting the needs of Queensland emergency departments. The major functionality deficiencies of the Medtrak Emergency system identified by the reference group included:
 - There is no pre-hospital event or 'patient expect' screen on the MedTrak system. This functionality was considered to be essential by the reference group. Similarly, the system does not provide ED's with the ability to record retrieval and transfer information
 - The Department View screen does not provide an updated list of patients waiting and does not have any built in logic to prioritise patients into the order by which they should be seen by the medical officers.
 - The ability to move patients between cubicles was considered by the reference group to be cumbersome. Likewise the system had limited functionality to track patients who were outside of the department.
- TrakHealth have indicated that the current version of MedTrak could be developed to meet the identified needs of Queensland emergency departments. The reference committee clearly articulated that proposed developments to MedTrak would only provide functionality equivalent to what already exists in EDIS. Further developments to the MedTrak product beyond this are likely to be costly in terms of dollars and time-frames.

Service Management Agreement (EDIS and ORMIS)

The Surgical Access Service finalised the Service Management Agreement with Information Services for the ongoing maintenance and support of the EDIS and ORMIS applications as well as for the maintenance of the Elective Surgery Reporting database (SATR). The total cost for Information Services to provide these services for 2002/2003 is \$151,018, which represents significant savings from the previous year's agreement.

6. HOSPITAL SUPPORT AND LIAISON

1. Medical Superintendents Advisory Committee

The Medical Superintendents Advisory Committee (MSAC) met on the 15th November 2002. The major outcomes from this meeting include:

- The Committee discussed the letters sent from the General Manager, Health Services requesting the nomination of an accountable officer for elective surgery from each site. Significant restructuring at individual sites has had an impact on the Medical Superintendents involvement in the state-wide elective surgery program.
- The revised Emergency Department Benchmarking Report was tabled at the meeting for discussion. The Committee were supportive of the revisions made to the report.
- Dr Michael Catchpole provided an overview to the committee on the Global Recruitment Campaign. Committee members were invited to participate in a telephone assessment of a number of overseas doctors to be held at the Royal Brisbane Hospital in December 2002.
- The Committee was informed that the Medical Rostering Project has been completed. Members of the Steering Committee are available to discuss the findings.

2. Elective Surgery Coordinators

A combined meeting of Elective Surgery Coordinators and Elective Surgery Liaison Officers met on the 29th November 2002. The major outcomes from this meeting include:

- Mr Gary Walker opened the meeting and provided an overview of the Waiting List Reduction Strategy. Mr Walker led a lively discussion of the major challenges facing hospitals in 2002/03 in the elective surgery area. Subsequent discussions were very constructive in identifying the major issues affecting elective surgery performance across the State.
- Members of the Procurement Strategy Unit presented a synopsis of a project they have been working on for the last 12 months "Progressing Day Surgery a district and corporate collaborative project". At the conclusion of the presentation, members of the ESC/ESLO group provided feedback to the project team regarding future possibilities.
- Members of the Marketing and Communications Team addressed the group and advised of how to present Elective Surgery initiatives in a positive light. An overview of how the media machine works and precautions to be exercised when writing reports and discussing issues related to Health were included in the discussion.
- Members of the SAS provided an overview of the Queensland Health Electronic Reporting System (QHERS). The SAS outlined possibilities for developing Crystal reports to assist in enhancing the day to day management of elective surgery waiting lists.

3. Policy Development

- Work has continued in relation to the development of state-wide policies to support the Waiting List Reduction Strategy. A draft of the Elective Surgery policy is near completion. It is anticipated the Specialist Outpatient Services draft will also be completed prior to the Christmas Break. The Emergency Department draft will be finalised by January.
- Focus groups for Elective Surgery and Specialist Outpatient services will be called to meet mid December to review the drafts and determine adjustments required in collaboration with members of the Surgical Access Service.
