Elective Surgery Activity vs Funding 1996/97 - 1999/2000

DIRECTOR-GENERAL'S COMMENTS:

PURPOSE:

To provide the Director-General with an overview of elective surgery activity performed versus dedicated funding provided for selected Queensland Health acute facilities over the period 1996/97 to 1999/2000. In addition, the Briefing provides an analysis of the various classes of hospital activity data over this time period in an attempt to explain the possible utilisation of dedicated elective surgery funds in areas other than elective surgery.

BACKGROUND:

Queensland Health has invested in excess of \$256M in the four-year period commencing 1996/97 for the purposes of improving access to and increasing throughput for elective surgery in Queensland public hospitals. Due to an ability of hospitals to shift activity across funding streams, particularly in 1996/97 and 1997/98, a proportion of the funding has been directed to areas other than elective surgery.


"Total elective surgery activity targets" were established in 1998/99 from activity coded as *elective* surgery by individual hospitals in the "base year" of 1996/97. Activity associated with additional dedicated elective surgery funding has been simply added to 1996/97 targets to determine the current year's elective surgery activity target (see Attachment 1). This strategy was adopted because of an ability of hospitals to claim activity that was achieved "in base" in one year against the additional activity targets associated with additional dedicated funds. The end result was that, in some hospitals, little additional elective surgery was being generated despite a considerable injection of new and dedicated funds. For example, an injection of an additional \$2.79M at the Gold Coast Hospital in 1997/98 achieved 660 elective surgery weighted separations (phase 5) less in 1997/98 than was achieved in 1996/97

In 2000/01, there is less funding available for elective surgery activity than in 1999/2000. In addition there has been a steadily increasing complexity of elective procedures performed in public hospitals over the past fours years. These factors, compounded by the fact that hospitals have improved "counting techniques" to maximise the activity that can be claimed against elective surgery activity targets, indicate that significantly less 'elective surgery' patients will be treated in 2000/01 compared to 1999/2000. A negative impact on elective surgery waiting lists is expected as a result.

KEY ISSUES:

1. Funded Elective Surgery Activity

The following graph shows the reported elective surgery activity for participating hospitals for the four year period commencing 1996/97.



Attributent 2 details the elective surgery activity for the facilities for the four-year period together will a increase in funding provided to each facility as a result of the Government's Surgery on Time program and subsequently, the Waiting List Reduction Strategy. The increase in dedicated funding over the four year period is compared with the increase in weighted activity over the period to arrive at an average cost per weighted separation for each facility.

The total increase in elective surgery activity between 1996/97 and 1999/2000 at the selected facilities is 44,588 weighted separations (phase 5) or an increase of 36.4%. The total increase in elective surgery funding associated with increased activity for the same period at the selected facilities amounts to \$33,786,793. This results in an average of \$758 per additional weighted separation (see Attachment 2).

Superficially, this appears to be a good result considering that all additional activity after 1998/99 has been funded at \$1,000 per weighted separation (Phase 5). However, a number of factors have impacted on achieving this result, not the least being the focus by hospitals on coding practices and data quality that will maximise the activity that can be claimed against "Total Elective Surgery Activity Targets".

An analysis of the trends in the major classes of hospital activity is included in "2. Four Year Trend Analysis" below. Despite the impact of the changes in coding practices, individual Hospitals that indicate a particularly poor return on funding invested include:



2.1 Other Elective Surgery

"O lective Surgery" is made up of procedural DRGs that fall outside of the National Data Definitions for elective surgery. They relate to a procedural DRG, are elective in nature, but are not classified as Category 1, 2 or 3 on the elective surgery waiting list or do not map to a surgical specialty. "Other Elective Surgery" includes dental procedures, some obstetric procedures, transplants, cosmetic surgery, and some 'scopes' and are excluded from elective surgery funded DRGs.




During the period 1996/97 to 1999/2000 for the selected facilities, 'Other Elective Surgery' decreased by 15,395 weighted separations or 31.5%. The indication is that a significant proportion of activity coded as non-funded elective surgery in 1996/97 and not included in elective surgery activity targets has now been included in elective surgery activity that can be counted against elective surgery activity targets. With the trend towards less invasive surgery, it would be expected that 'other elective surgery' would have increased over this period, not decreased markedly.

Those hospitals reporting a significant decrease in "Other Elective Surgery" over the four year period are included in the following table:

2.2 Emergency Surgery

Ov period 1996/97 to 1999/2000, emergency surgery activity decreased by 289 weighted separations or 0.3%. More significantly, from 1998/99 to 1999/2000 activity reported as emergency surgery decreased by 5,452 weighted separations or 5.2%.



Increased emergency surgical demand has been provided as a rationale by some hospitals for an inability to control elective surgery waiting lists. Improved "counting techniques" has the potential to impact on elective surgery throughput. As an example, Princess Alexandra Hospital reduced reported emergency surgery activity by 2,441 weighted separations in one year from 1998/99 to 1999/2000. Once again, the indication at some hospitals is that a significant proportion of activity coded as emergency surgery in 1996/97 or even 1997/98 or 1998/99 and obviously not included in elective surgery activity targets, has now been included in elective surgery activity that can be counted against elective surgery activity targets.




The reported data shows that 5,452 weighted separations less emergency surgery activity was recorded in 1999/2000 compared with 1998/99. If individual hospital reductions in reported emergency surgery are totalled from the year of peak activity (rather than from 1996/97), the total reduction in emergency surgery activity exceeds 10,000 weighted separations.

2.7 \(\text{ical Activity (Emergency and Elective)}\)

In the period 1996/97 to 1999/2000, medical activity increased by 30,949 weighted separations or 8.6%. The increase in medical activity has traditionally been funded from Growth Funds. Elective Medical inpatient activity, after increasing fairly uniformly for three years, has reduced significantly (some 10,194 weighted separations or 8.3%) from 1998/99 to 1999/2000. This may be explained in part by the implementation of strategies to reduce impatient activity at some hospitals in 1999/2000 in the interest of budget integrity, eg. ward closures at Royal Brisbane Hospital.



Emergency Medical inpatient activity, has increased steadily over the four year period.



ADDDITIONAL ANALYSIS:

Advice from the General Manager, Health Services suggested that an additional level of insight would be provided by comparing "Total Elective Surgery" activity against additional elective surgery funding. "Total Elective Surgery" activity has been calculated by adding "Elective Surgery" activity and "Other Elective Surgery" activity. This analysis has been provided at **Attachment 4**.

COMMENT:

This Briefing provides a superficial analysis of the trends in reported hospital inpatient activity over the period 1996/97 to 1999/2000. It is apparent that significant changes in various classes of hospital activity have occurred over this period according to the reported data.

The establishment of a "Elective Surgery Activity Target" in 1998/99 resulted in a much greater focus by hospitals on data and data quality and on maximising activity claimed against this target. Certainly, advice from hospital staff supports this contention. Elective Surgery is the only class of hospital activity that has a specific activity target attached and a strong incentive to meet these targets has been provided in the form of potential budget adjustments if targets are not reached.

Numerous system changes have occurred over the last four years that may have an effect on hospital activity trends. A change to AN DRG Version 4.1 in the Hospital Funding Model on 1 July 1999 is one such change. Other changes such as the introduction of random breath testing in Queensland was predicted to decrease trauma admissions to Emergency Departments. However, the assertion remains that the reported increase of some 44,500 weighted separations in elective surgery activity from 1996/97 to 1999/2000 may be significantly offset by activity previously coded as "Other Elective Surgery" or "Emergency Surgery".

BUNEFITS AND COSTS:

Queensland Health has invested in excess of \$256M in the four-year period commencing 1996/97 for the purposes of improving access to and increasing throughput for elective surgery in Queensland public hospitals. The hospital morbidity data indicates that an additional 44,588 weighted separations (phase 5) (+36.4%) has been achieved over this period with an increase in funding of \$33,787,000.

However, an analysis of the other classes of hospital activity indicates a possible shift of coding practices such that activity that was not included in establishing activity targets in 1996/97 is now counted against that target. Such practices would allow the movement of funding away from elective surgery. The extent of this change in coding practice is unclear without further analysis, but may be significant.


The concern is that significantly less 'elective surgery' patients will be treated in 2000/01 compared to 1999/2000. Raw data reported through the Elective Admissions Management module shows that for the first six months of 2000/01, 2,440 less patients were treated compared with the same period last year. If this concern is real, increased demand for elective surgery is expected as a result that will be reflected either in increased waiting times for elective surgery or in increased waiting times for a specialist surgical outpatients appointment.

ACTIONS REQUIRED:

It is recommended:

- 1. That the Director-General note the information provided.
- 2. That the Briefing be used as the basis of a more detailed analysis at the hospital level. Reported activity data should be provided to individual hospitals for comment.
- 3. That a new funding model be developed for elective surgery.
